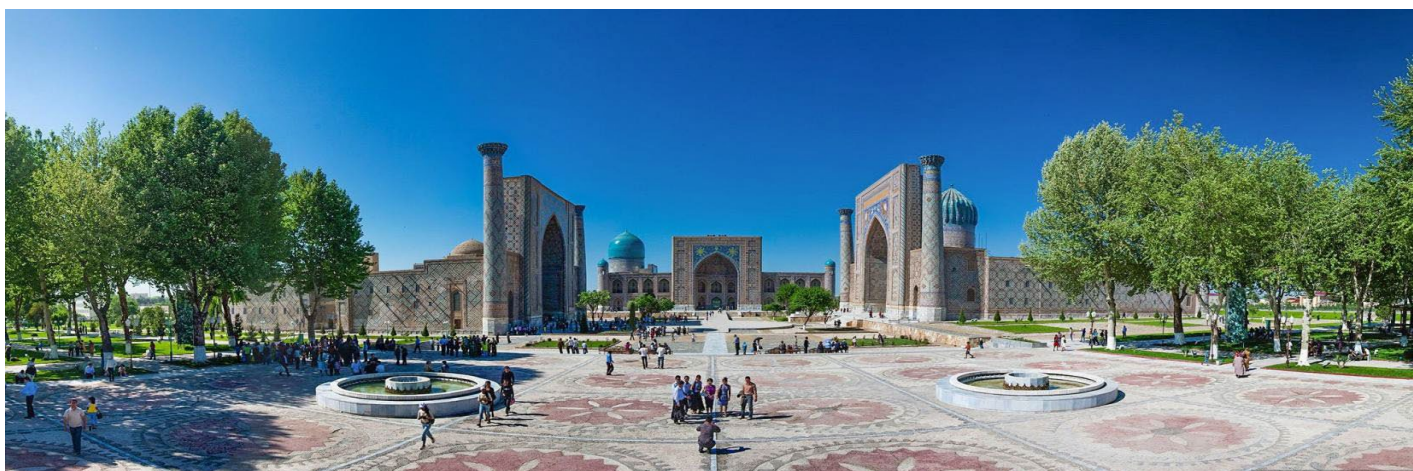


MAGICAL UZBEKISTAN

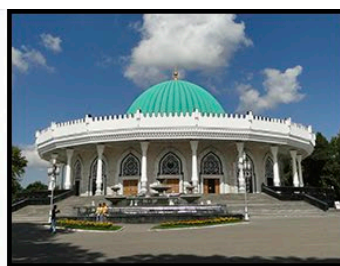
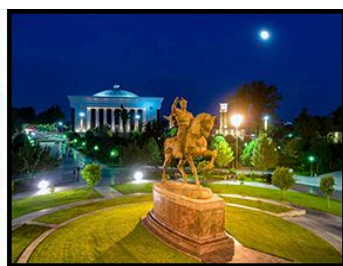
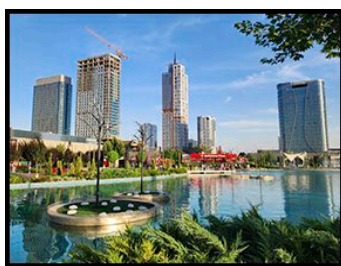


This short but rich in history and experiences tour covers three main cities of Uzbekistan, the capital - Tashkent and of **most ancient cities of the world - Samarkand, Bukhara**. World famous monuments of ancient architecture remember **Alexander the Great and Genghis Khan**. In Medieval times Samarkand was the center of **Tamerlane's Empire**. Here more than 20 centuries ago numerous caravans carried precious silk, gold, porcelain and spices along the Great Silk Road connecting China to Europe. Tall and elegant minarets, grandiose madrasahs and mosques, medieval palaces and mausoleums decorated with incredibly rich ceramic ornaments, bustle and colors of oriental bazaars, thrilling legends, you will taste delicious dishes of Uzbek cuisine, get acquainted with the original art of local craftsmen. warm hospitality and ancient traditions of local people will leave indelible imprints in the memory of tourists.

Itinerary: Tashkent –Samarkand– Bukhara

PROGRAM OF THE TOUR

Day 1. Tashkent is the capital of Uzbekistan, the largest metropolis in Central Asia with 3.5 million people and a 25-century history.



Arrival to Tashkent. Transfer to the hotel and rest. Early check in. (NOT INCLUDED)

14.00. Sightseeing in Tashkent: Old city: architectural and religious complex Khast-Imam (Khazret-Imam), with a grandiose Friday mosque, the medieval mausoleum Kafal Shashi (XVI century); Barak Khan madrasah (XVI century); Muiy Muborak madrasah with one of their original Korans Caliph Osman (VII century), the oldest in the world; Kukeldash madrasah (XVI-XVII); colorful oriental bazaar Chorsu; People's Friendship Square; Amir Temur (Tamerlane) square with a park, an equestrian statue of Tamerlane, surrounded by historical and administrative buildings - the Palace of Forums, the Temurids Museum, Tashkent chimes, the original hotel building "Uzbekistan"; the monument "Courage" - a memorial about the devastating disaster - the Tashkent earthquake of 1966; the Opera and Ballet Theater (1945) and the light and music fountain; Mustakillik (Independence) Square with the Independence Monument, the Ezgulik arch, the eternal flame, fountains; Palace of Grand Duke N.K. Romanov (1891), Metro. Overnight at hotel.

Day 2. Samarkand is the oldest city in the East with a 27-century history, the same age as Rome, the UNESCO facility.

After breakfast transfer to Samarkand by speed train "Afrosiab" 8.00 - 10.30.

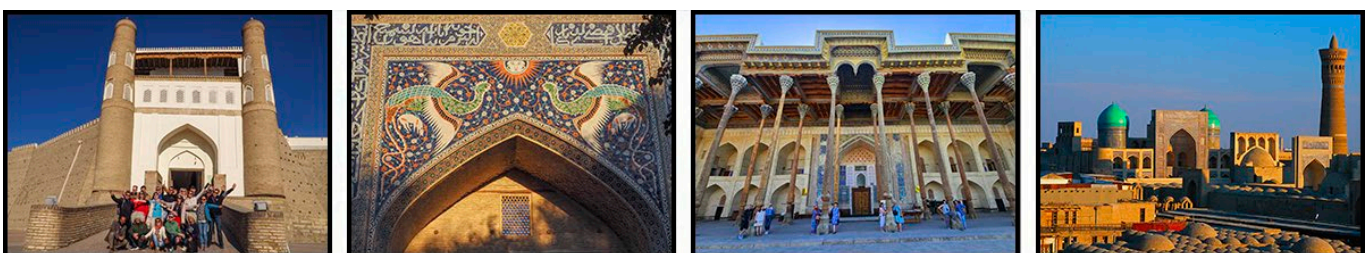
After arriving to Samarkand. Sightseeing; Registan square – the "heart" of Samarkand - ensemble of 3 majestic madrasahs (XIV-XVI c.c.) – Sherdor, Ulugbek and Tillya Qory, Bibi-Khanum the gigantic cathedral Mosque (XV c.), Gur-Emir Mausoleum of Timur (Tamerlane), his sons and grandson Ulugbek (XV c.). Siab bazaar. Overnight at hotel.



Day 3. Continue Sightseeing in Samarkand: Tamerlane’s grandson Ulugbek’s the well-known ruler and astronomer-scientist observatory (1420 y.) - the remains of an immense (30 m. tall) astrolabe for observing stars position, Shakh-i-Zinda – “The Living King” (XI-XVIII c.c.) Necropolis of Samarkand rulers and noblemen, consisting of set of superb decorated mausoleums, Ethnic village of Kanigil, “ Eternal City” complex. Overnight at hotel



Day 4. Transfer from Samarkand to Bukhara by speed train "Afrosiab" 10:30-11:50. Sightseeing in Bukhara the Samanids mausoleum (IX-X cc), Ark citadel (IV-XX cc) - the oldest residence of the Emirs, Chor-Minor – the original building of four minarets (XIX c). Sitorai-Mohi-Hosa Palace (XIX-XX cc) - country summer palace of Bukhara Emirs. Overnight at hotel



Day 5. Bukhara is one of the oldest cities in the East with a 25-century history, the spiritual capital of Uzbekistan, UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Continue of sightseeing in Bukhara: (walking): “The heart of Bukhara – historic- architectural complex Lyabi-Khauz with the oldest in Central Asia pool (XIV-XVII c) surrounded by medieval buildings madrasah and khanaka of Nadira Divan-begi (XV-XVI c) with the facade, decorated with gorgeous mosaic, Kukeldash madrasah (XV c) - the largest madrasah in Bukhara. Poi-Kalyan Complex includes: 48 m minaret Kalyan (XII c) – the symbol of Bukhara; large Friday mosque Kalyan (XV c) with galleries topped with 288 domes of 1 hectare area; the only one active madrasah in Bukhara Miri-Arab (XVI c). Free time for shopping. Overnight at hotel



Day 6. Departure to home.

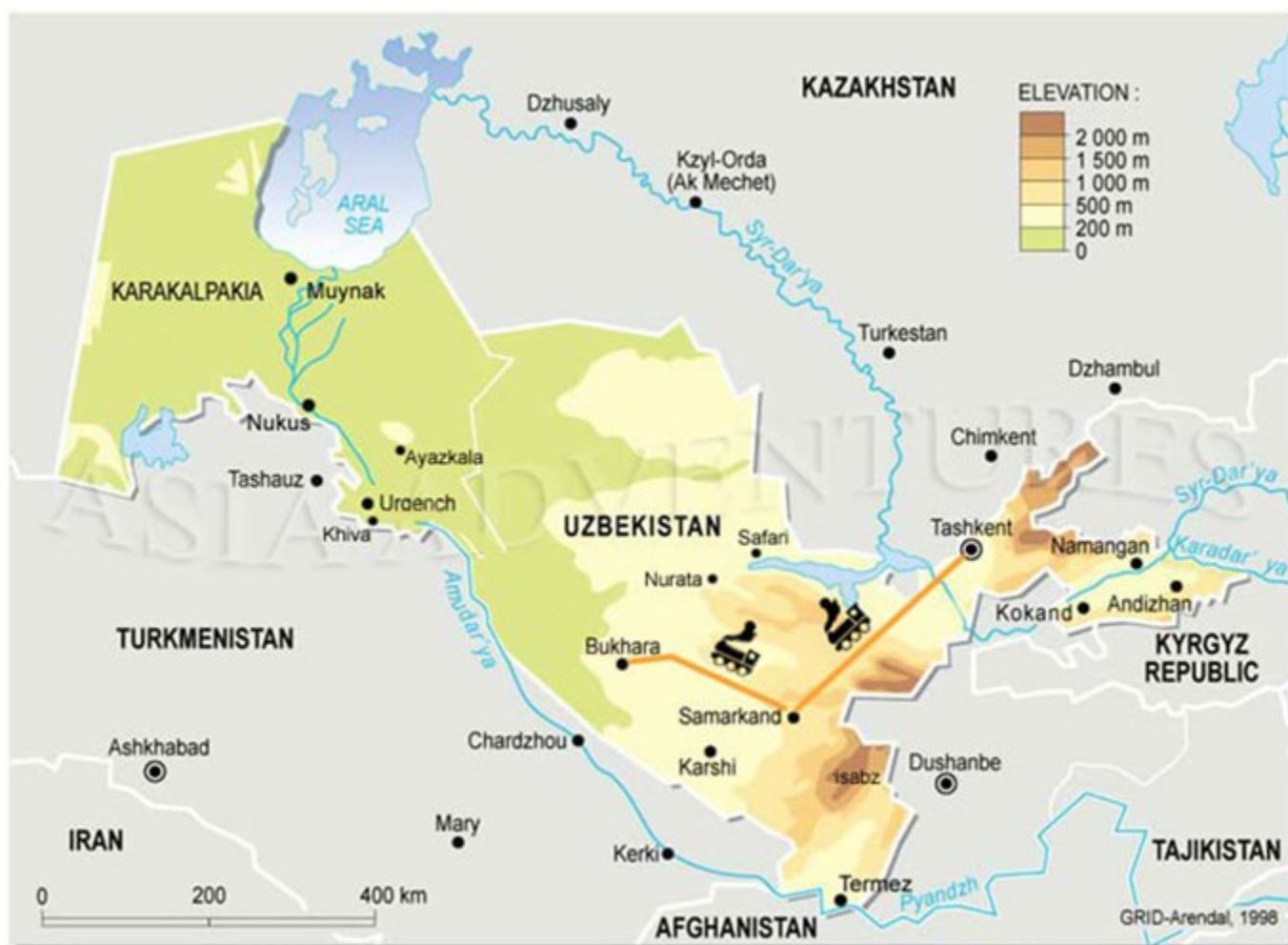
